You are invited to participate in a survey as part of the research project described below.

What is the project about?

This research project will explore doctors' experiences of the sudden death of a medical colleague due to an accident, catastrophic medical event, or suicide.

The aim is to understand the experience of doctors who experience the death of a colleague This includes understanding how doctors coped, what support they received and what support may have been helpful.

Who is undertaking the project?

This project is being conducted by The University of Notre Dame Australia and Doctors' Health NSW with funding from NSW Health. The researchers are A/Prof Meagan Brennan, Dr Margaret Kay, Ms Amy Webster and Dr Kathryn Hutt.

What will I be asked to do?

You will be asked to complete an online survey. It will ask questions about your experience with the death of a medical colleague, including what it was like for you, what support you received and what support may have been helpful. It should take you about 20–30 minutes. The survey is completely anonymous.

Are there any risks associated with participating in this project?

The topic of the survey is extremely sensitive. You may find it difficult to think about the death of your colleague. It is possible that you may become distressed during or after completing the survey.

You can choose which questions you would like to answer. You can also choose to stop the survey at any time and to decline to submit your responses. There is no penalty for this.

What are the benefits of the research project?

We cannot promise that you will receive any benefits from participating in this research. However, we expect that the results of this study will help us better understand and help doctors who experience the death of a colleague in the future.

What if I change my mind?

Participation in this study is completely voluntary. Even if you begin the survey, you are free to withdraw by simply not completing it. However, once you complete the survey and submit it, you won't be able to withdraw it because we will have no way of knowing which response is yours.

How will you keep my information private and confidential?

Completed surveys will be stored securely on the survey platform and in a secure data base at Doctors' Health NSW. Only the researchers named on this sheet will have access to this information during the project.

Once the study is completed, the data collected from you will be stored securely as per university policy for research data management. The data may be used in future research. The results of the study will be published as a journal article and/or conference presentation. Information gathered about you will be held in strict confidence and will not be released by the researcher to a third party unless required to do so by law.

Will I be able to find out the results of the project?

Once we have analysed the information from this study we will put a summary on the Doctors' NSW website and AMA NSW newsletter. No identifying information about you will be included.

It will take around 9 months for the results to be available.
